

An autumn Amish quilt show and sale in Sister Bay, a Spooktacular Hike in Peninsula State Park (for all ages), and an art

More Dutch Oven cooking! This recipe is a great side dish for fall camping meals. Or bake it in your trailer oven!

Hash Brown Casserole

Ingredients:

2 pounds of hash browns (frozen hash browns thawed) 1/16 ounce sour cream 1 can of cream of chicken soup 1/4 - 1/2 cup green onions (chopped) 1 stick butter (or margarine)

2 cup sharp cheddar cheese 1 can French fried (grated) onions

Directions:

- 1. Put uncooked hash brown potatoes in a large bowl and season with salt and pepper to taste.
- 2. Melt butter and add onions, sour cream, soup, 1 cup of cheddar cheese. Mix with hash browns.
- 3. Pour into oiled Dutch oven; put fried onions in a ring around the top and fill the center with cheese.
- 4. Place dutch oven on a rack over a low fire (about 12 inches above the highest flame) and bake for 45 minutes, or until hash browns are completely warm and cheese melts.
- 5. If you are cooking inside: place mixture in a 9x13 inch baking dish and bake at 350 degrees for about 45 minutes. Serves 8-10.

Sojourn in Colorado- 2007

After the Rocky Mountain Vintage Rally (July) in Breckenridge, Gene, Greg and I decided to explore more of Colorado- it had been 41 years since we briefly visited! We



caravanned to Montrose, CO with another "vintage" couple who lived there. This was the first endurance test for the diesel, to make it over Monarch Pass, Elev. 11,312 ft. We stopped at the Continental Divide for a photo op since the day was our wedding anniversary.

Montrose is a great western town of 17,000 people. It is relatively flat; however the area around it is mostly mountains. We did day trips from there to Ouray, Telluride and Black Canyon National Park.

After leaving Montrose we headed for Durango and our long awaited ride on the Durango-Silverton narrow gauge



railroad. We left promptly at 9:00am for an all day excursion. I have no words to describe the beautiful scenery along the Animas River as we road along the edge of the mountains. It took three and a half hours to get to Silverton where we spent our 2 hour layover with Michael and Tracy- another couple we met at the Rocky Mt Rally. We vowed to return to this little town-Michael and Tracy said the snow in the winter comes up to their kitchen window!

While in Mesa Verdes National Park we spent a day going to the "Four Corners" (which charges \$3 just to stop in at the spot where Arizona, Colorado, Utah and New Mexico meet.) There you can do the "Frog" by putting two hands in two states and your two feet in the other two states.

In Cortez, Colorado, we discovered an Airstream coffee shop that had more business than it could handle on a Monday morning! Gigi Schwartz, the owner of the Silver Bean, jumpstarts everyone's day with coffee served from a 1969 Overlander complete with a white picket fence and pink flamingos.

Gigi was originally from Green Lake and attended Ripon College. She was extra friendly when she saw our WI license plate. We met her on a Sunday when she had some time to talk. She told us she loves living in CO, has two kids, Ben is 7 weeks old; she had him with her on Monday morning. She wants a vintage Airstream hat, and wanted Gene's in trade for a coffee mug.
