

Congratulations

John & Barb Sellers had planned to spend a relaxed September at their Minnesota lake cabin but ended up making an unplanned trip to Ohio and back. When they returned from the Region 7 Rally in Huron, one of the items waiting in their overstuffed post office box was a letter from the Ohio State University College of Nursing, notifying Barb that she had been selected for the 2007 Annual Nursing Alumni Public Service Award.

At first Barb suspected one of her friends was playing a joke on her—after all, she's been retired for four years—but when she called the College of Nursing she found that it was legitimate. She was nominated by a Dayton colleague for her work at the Wright State University Center for Healthy Communities, setting up the Ohio Grandparent-Grandchildren Initiative (GPGCI) to assist grandparents who were raising grandchildren—often unexpectedly—as a result of incapacitation of their parents by such causes as illness, death, addiction, and imprisonment. Barb initiated a comprehensive range of programs including the establishment of Kinship Navigators in each county to assist kinship caregivers in finding their way around the legal bureaucracy, and Kinship Klosets to provide child care supplies such as clothing, bedding, etc. to grandparents suddenly in need of them.

Audrey Sinner recently discovered Dutch Oven cooking and here is her first successful recipe!

Mexican Lasagna in Dutch Oven

2 lb. ground beef
2 pkg. taco seasoning mix
1/2 cup water
1 (14.5 oz) diced tomatoes
2 eggs
16 oz cottage cheese
4 C. Mexican blend shredded cheese
Large flour tortillas

Brown ground beef. Add taco seasoning and water. Stir and add the tomatoes. In a separate bowl, mix eggs, cottage cheese and 3 cups of Mexican cheese. In Dutch oven, start with scoop of the meat mixture on the bottom. Next layer tortilla, 1/4 meat mixture, 1/4 cheese mixture. Repeat layers ending with a tortilla on top. Add remaining 1 cup of cheese on top of tortilla. Bake for 30 minutes at 350 degrees.

For Dutch Oven cooking with charcoal briquettes to cook at 350 degrees use 25 briquettes (17 top/8 bottom) with 12" Dutch Oven. Or bake in your oven for 30 min. at 350 degrees.



Plan Ahead for Thunder Bay 2008!



Passports are needed to enter Canada.....if you intend to cross the border to return home to Wisconsin!

Many of you have heard about the vacation nightmares around the U.S this summer in the wake

of the new Passport requirements for travel outside of the United States. And with the implementation of the new law, the State Department was inundated with applications. What used to be three to six week processing has turned into a prayer that the new passports will arrive in three to six months.

Region 1st Vice President Don Rogers urges everyone who doesn't already have a current passport, or if it will be expiring next year, to apply NOW. Don is planning an exciting Region 7 Rally next year in Thunder Bay, Ontario- a mere 586 miles from Milwaukee!

It's not just about being able to go to the Region Rally next year. Needing a passport is a sign of the future, and there is talk about making passport requirements for domestic travel on airlines, and even entrance to national parks. Having your passport ready for any last minute or unplanned travel, is something every WI Unit member should consider.

New Application for a U.S. Passport

To obtain a passport for the first time, you need to go in person to one of over 9,000 passport acceptance facilities located throughout the United States with two photographs of yourself, proof of U.S. citizenship, and a valid form of photo identification such as a driver's license. If the name on your birth certificate is different because of marriage- bring a copy of your marriage certificate.

Acceptance facilities include many Federal, state and probate courts, post offices, some public libraries and a number of county and municipal offices. There are also 13 regional passport agencies, and 1 Gateway City Agency, which serve customers who are traveling within 2 weeks (14 days), or who need foreign visas for travel. Appointments are required in such cases.

You'll need to apply in person if you are applying for a U.S. passport for the first time: if your expired U.S. passport is not in your possession; if your previous U.S. passport has expired and was issued more than 15 years ago; if your previous U.S. passport was issued when you were under age 16; or if your currently valid U.S. passport has been lost or stolen.

Renewal of a U.S. Passport

You can renew by mail if: Your most recent passport is available to submit and it is not damaged; you received the passport within the past 15 years; you were over age 16 when it was issued; you still have the same name, or can legally document your name change.

You can get a passport renewal application form by downloading it from http://www.travel.state.gov/
If your passport has been, altered or damaged, you cannot apply by mail. You must apply in person. For more information on how to renew a passport, please visit the "How to renew a passport page".



June 2008: Yellowstone Trail Caravan to Bozeman, Montana International Rally.Caravan Leader: Ed Emerick


