In Memoriam, Dean W. Kyle, 1928 - 2013

We are sad to report the passing of Dean Kyle, of Shawano, Wisconsin and Sweet Home, Oregon.

For newer members who may not know the story, Pearl Adams-Kyle and her late husband Fred Adams were kingpins of the Wisconsin Unit and Region 7 for many years. Fred was Wisconsin Unit President in 1999 followed by Pearl in 2002; Pearl was Region 7 President 2006-08. Fred passed away in 2005, and in the fullness of time, Pearl met Dean Kyle and they were married.

This week came the news that Dean had passed away on February 4. Our deepest sympathy goes out to Pearl, now widowed once again. We can do no better than the Manak's reminiscences that accompanied the news of Dean's passing.

"It is with much sadness that we are sending news of Dean Kyle's passing on February 4th. As many of you know, Dean was an member of WBCCI for many years and was active with the WI Unit, volunteering his time and talent to Airstream events including Unit, Region, and International Rallies. We first met Dean at the Region 7 Rally in Baraboo, WI in 2006 where he assisted Pearl Adams, then President of the Region 7 and soon-to-be spouse, in running a fun circus-themed rally. As we became better acquainted with him and Pearl through our past 6 years in WBCCI, we came to know him for his energy, expertise and passion for Airstreaming. Those qualities were inspiring and he served as a valuable resource to many of us as we "traveled down the road" as fellow Airstreamers. He will be remembered as a warm friend and will be greatly missed."

Dean W. Kyle July 31, 1928 - February 4, 2013



Dean W. Kyle, 84, passed away at home in Sweet Home after a prolonged battle with cancer. He was born in Geneva, Wisconsin to Willard and Dorothy (Anderson) Kyle. Dean lived in Wisconsin and Oregon. He practiced developmental optometry in Prairie du Sac, Wisconsin, Cottage Grove, Sweet Home and Brownsville.

Dean married his first wife, Mary Ann, in 1954, and together they raised three daughters and

enjoyed many aspects of life in the communities where they lived. Mary Ann preceded Dean in death in 2003.

Dean was an active part of the Sweet Home community for many years involved with Sweet Home Evangelical Church, Lions Club, Kiwanis, and other community organizations.

Dean's main passion in life was to travel with a trailer of some kind in tow. He enjoyed his association and adventures with the Wally Byam Caravan Club International, the Airstream RV Owners Association. He was also an avid Green Bay Packers and University of Oregon football fan and enjoyed photography, bow hunting, model railroading, and a host of other interests.

In 2006, Dean married Pearl Adams of Shawano, Wisconsin and enjoyed his travels with her.

Dean is survived by: his daughters, Kimberly and son-in-law Chuck Messick of Sweet Home, Kirsten and son-in-law George Offutt of Sweet Home, and Deanna and son-in-law Ron Emmert of Corvallis; five grandchildren; and two great grandchildren.

A memorial service will be held at 11:00 a.m., Friday, February 15, at Sweet Home Evangelical Church. The family requests that memorial contributions be made to Sweet Home Evangelical Church or Sweet Home Emergency Ministries.

Arrangements are under the direction of Sweet Home Funeral Chapel.

Paradise Park Punta Gorda, Florida

This year Barb and I are doing the "snowbird" thing at Paradise Park, one of several Airstream parks in Florida. Paradise Park is a condominium—all spaces are privately owned, together with their share of the common facilities—which, as in most Airstream parks, are extensive!

The main park attraction is the golf course, but there are also two lakes, shuffleboard, bocci ball & basketball courts, etc.

Owing to tax and zoning laws and condo association rules, all 314 lots are very similar. In addition to a full-hookup RV pad, most include an 8'x10' "shed" and a 10'x20' "cabana", or "Florida room". Both are usually well furnished. The shed in the space we are renting contains a toilet, sink, and full-sized shower stall, large refrigerator, over/under washerdryer, and even some storage! At any given time 20 or 30 spaces are available for rent. Spaces available for rent and for sale are listed on the park web site, www.ppca.us

The folks at Paradise Park are friendly, and will party at the drop of a hat. We happened to be here for Festival Week, essentially celebrating that they don't have winter here!

This park is unusually dog friendly. Probably half the residents own dogs. There are dog walking areas and a fenced dog park. Golf carts are the most popular conveyance in the park. Our dogs *love* to ride in ours, but we have to stop every few lots so people can meet the dogs!

Paradise park *is* kinda out in the boonies. It's 20 miles to the nearest grocery store or gas station. The towns of Punta Gorda, Port Charlotte, and Arcadia are roughly equidistant. All offer shopping and thngs to see and do.

All in all a friendly place—a good place to consider if you want to go snowbirding in a tropical climate. Sun and palm trees included—Margaritas optional—mix your own!




