#### **Business Meeting Report**

#### 2013 International Ballot Results

The results of ballots cast at the spring business meeting at the April luncheon and by mail are as follows:

#### International Officers

The International Nominating Committee only nominated one candidate for each International office. All received the unanimous vote of the Wisconsin Unit.

International President – John Stumpf
First Vice President – Joe Perryman
Second Vice President – Jim Schwerdfeger
Third Vice President – Richard Girard
Recording Secretary – Louise Humble
Treasurer – Ron Gordy

Nominating Committee (2 openings) – Jim Polk

Although two people are elected to the International Nominating Committee, only Jim Polk had been nominated when the ballot was certified to the units by April 1. Afterwards Ann Wirth was named as a candidate in the *Blue Beret*. She received several votes as a write-in candidate, and will be supported by the unit.

#### **Proposed Constitutional Amendment**

The unit rejected the proposed Non-Airstream Motor Home amendment by a vote of 80% NO, 20% YES, both as proposed, and as may be amended by the delegates.

#### **Delegate Authorization**

The unit voted unanimously to authorize its delegate to cast the unit's vote in accordance with his understanding of the unit's wishes on matters that may come before the delegates which were not voted upon by the unit.

#### **New Business**

Article VI, Section 3 of the WBCCI bylaws requires units to resubmit their unit constitutions and bylaws (C&BL) for approval by the International C&BL Committee at five year intervals. The Wisconsin Unit C&BL were last approved in 2007 and are due for reapproval. The WBCCI Blue Book includes a Model Unit C&BL which are revised from time to time, and which have been revised since the Wisconsin Unit C&BL were last approved. Early this year the Unit C&BL Committee (Bob Manak and John Sellers) examined our existing C&BL and found that some changes were necessary to comply with mandatory provisions of the Model C&BL.

After considerable discussion, the Unit Executive Committee decided to make the necessary changes to the Unit Bylaws and to recommend the necessary changes to the Unit Constitution for the membership to vote on at the fall business meeting. The changes are not very controversial.

The only change required to the Unit Bylaws is the addition of one sentence to Article VI, Delegates:

"An Affiliate Member of this unit who is a regular member in the same region may be appointed if the unit has no Regular Members who are going to attend the Delegates Meeting."

The purpose of this change is make it easier to find a delegate as attendance at the International Rally declines.

Full details of the recommended amendments to the Unit Constitution will be provided along with the ballot for the fall business meeting. Essentially the change consists of allowing voting at Unit business meetings by electronic means (fax or email) as well as by mail or in person as allowed by our present Constitution. The Unit C&BL committee has also recommended some additional minor "housekeeping" changes.

After the fall business meeting the Unit C&BL will be sent to the International C&BL Committee for approval. In the event that the International C&BL committee does not approve the revised Unit C&BL, this might be an ongoing process. Only time will tell.

Camping will be at Snyder Park, a Clark County park located on Snyder Lake, offering 35 electric campsites (10 non-electric), beach, launch ramp and picnic area with shelters, flush toilets and showers, and a dump station. 
Directions from US41/M28:
