Because of their durable construction, somewhere between 60% to 70% of all Airstreams ever built are still on the road today. Due to the interest in and availability of old Airstreams, a niche developed that needed to be filled. As a result in 1993 the Vintage Airstream Club (VAC) was formed as an Intra-Club within the Wally Byam Caravan Club International (WBCCI). As an "Intra-Club" - a club within a club - you must first be a member of the WBCCI to join the VAC. The VAC provides resources for members of the oldest Airstream trailers. Check out their website at vintageairstreamclub.com.

So if a new Airstream is not in your budget or you just like to do things "Old School", there are plenty of our Silver Beauties out there looking for a new home. 



We will hop on the Dells Boat Tours and see the most "classic" of the area's - the "dells" rock formations that tower above the river. At the


Stand Rock shore landing, the photo that made
