For those attending the International Rally in Escanaba, MI...there is a breakfast meeting scheduled; see your packet materials for specific information.


- * Outside: Take a look at the hitch...do you have fuses handy? Have you greased appropriate hitch components? (I have to add grease my system every 1000 miles or it can cause damage to the bushings...who knew?)
- *Outside: Check locks and system components (grey/black water; hot water heater) for leaks or malfunctions.
- *Inside: Do you need to replace lights? Could your storage arrangements stand some changing?
- *Inside: Check for loose cabinets, hinges or items that need replacing/refreshing or reorganizing. Do you really need to carry items you have not used or worn in years?

You might be interested in purchasing a small spiral bound book written by Rich Luhr titled: The Nearly Complete Guide to Airstream Maintenance [\$27.95 which can be purchased at airstreamlife.com or Amazon.] This book is small in size but loaded with information on the maintenance of an Airstream. I have found it helpful in identifying projects that can support a successful camping and travel experience. [This is even a good source for those seasoned folks with a vintage Airstream... and you don't need a major degree to understand the various Airstream components or



systems.]


